Change in Competition Schedule

The Boxing Competition will be held in 10 weight categories as per schedule drawn.

However, some changes may occur if deemed necessary by the Technical Delegate on behalf of AIBA or Delhi 2010 upon receipt of final individual entries.

Any such changes will be communicated to participating CGAs in the Team Leaders Guides distributed prior to Games time, or at the Sport Technical Briefing.

3. Commendations

Medals will be awarded as follows:

First Prize: Gold medal and a Diploma for the winner in each body weight category

Second Prize: Silver medal and a Diploma for the Boxer placed second in each weight category.

Third Prize: Bronze medal and a Diploma for the Boxer placed third in each weight category.

One (1) Gold, One (1) Silver and two (2) Bronze medals will be awarded in all weight categories where at least six CGAs from 3 CGF Regions are represented, in accordance with the CWG Sport Manual.

4. Competition Rules and Regulations

The Delhi 2010 Commonwealth Games Boxing competition will be conducted in 10 weight categories in accordance with the rules and regulations of AIBA.

- Bouts will be of 3 rounds of 3 minutes each with 1 minute rest in between Rounds.
- Competing Boxers must be not less than 17 years old and not more than 34 years old in the year of competition.
- Competing Boxer will not use red or pink gum shield.
- Boxer will use headgear provided by Organizers and is not permitted to use his own headgear.
- Competing Boxer will be clean shaven, without moustache.
- Competing boxer can use Vaseline on his eyebrows but not on his body.
- Each boxer shall produce his AIBA competition record book at the medical examination, which must contain the certificates of basic medical examination and a confirmation of the annual medical examination.
- Mouth guards/Gum shield should be “form fitted” and should not be of red or pink color
- AIBA approved Bandages will be provided for each Competitor, must be worn by the competitor and should be stamped by the Gloves Steward. The use of personal bandages will not be allowed.

4.1 Medical Examinations and Weigh-Ins

The preliminary Medical and General Weigh-in for all Boxers will take place from 0800 hrs to 1000 hrs on Monday 04th October, 2010 at the Games Village

As required by AIBA rules, Boxers will attend a medical examination and weigh-in between 0800 hrs and 0900 hrs on the day that they are drawn to compete.

In accordance with AIBA rules, Boxers failing to attend the Medicals and Weigh-in at the specified time will be eliminated from the Competition. Calibrated weigh-in scales will be available at the Games Village. All scales will be calibrated daily, before the official weigh-in.

The weight recorded during the General weigh-in, will decide the weight category in which the Boxer must compete for the duration of the Games.

4.2 Draw

The Technical Delegate will preside during the Draw.

The Official Draw for the Competition will be held immediately after the Official Medicals and General Weigh – in, in front of the Team Officials on 4 - 10 – 2010 at 11.a.m. until the last weight category is completed. If there is any mistake or unavoidable circumstances taking place, the Technical Delegate has the right to order the particular weight draw(s) to be done again.

4.3 The Bout

All Bouts shall consist of 3 Rounds of three minutes each with a one minute interval between each round. Each contested Bout will have the following AIBA qualified Neutral Officials: 3 Jury members, 1 Referee and 5 Judges. Each of the Judges will score through the AIBA approved electronic scoring system which will decide the winner of the Bout.

4.4 Decisions

The following decisions will be used when announcing the result of the Bout:

- 1) Win on Points
- 2) Win by Retirement
- 3) Win by Referee Stopping Contest (RSC)
 - a) Outclassed (OC)
 - b) Injury (I)
- 4) Win by Referee Stopping Contest- Head Blow (RSC - H)
- 5) Win by Disqualification
- 6) Win by Knock out
- 7) Win by Walk Over
- 8) No Contest
- 9) Incidents in the Ring outside the control of the referees

5. Sport Equipment

AIBA approved Sport Equipment will be used

5.1 Gloves:

Competition gloves will conform to the AIBA requirements. Accordingly the competition gloves will weigh 10 ounces and will have Velcro fitting. There will be no white patch on the knuckle portion of the gloves. The color of the Boxing gloves should be the same as the color of the Boxer's Corner.

5.2 Head guards:

The head guards will conform to the AIBA requirements. AIBA approved Head guards will be provided by the organizers and Boxers are not permitted to use their personal head guards. The color of the Boxing Head guards of a Boxer should be the same as the color of his Corner

5.3 Gum shield:

Boxers must use a Gum shield during the Bout. Gum shield used by the boxers should be "form fitted". Red and Pink color gum shields are not permitted.

5.4. Bandages:

Boxers should wear Bandages under the competition gloves that will be provided by the Organizers which conform to the AIBA regulations. Bandages have to be duly stamped by the Gloving Marshal before gloves are issued to the Boxers

5.5 Cup Protectors/ Abdominal Guards:

Every competing Boxer must wear a Cup protector or Abdominal Guard which is the part of the Dress Regulations for the Boxers.

6. Timing, Scoring & Results

Swiss Timing has been appointed as the "Official Timekeeper" for the Delhi 2010 Commonwealth Games. Swiss Timing is responsible for the full delivery of Timing, Scoring & Results services for all sports as part of the total turnkey contract and sponsorship agreement

7. Athletes Uniform

During competition, each athlete is expected to compete in their official CGA team uniform.

Athletes clothing and personal equipment must comply with the GFS10 of the CGF Games Family Services Manual.

The Athletes uniform will conform to AIBA regulations.

7.1 Boxing Athlete Uniform:

- Competition Gloves.
- Head guards
- Gum shield
- Bandages
- Cup protector/abdominal guards
- Shorts / Vests
- Boxing Shoes

7.2 Shorts / Vests:

A Boxer is permitted to wear Shorts and Vest of any color. The waist line should be indicated by a different color sash 10 cm wide.

Print on the clothing should conform to AIBA regulations.

7.3 Boxing Shoes:

A Boxer should wear flat shoes of any color. The length of the socks should be displayed above the shoes.

8. Entries

All entries must be submitted in accordance with the Delhi 2010 Sport Entry Pack, which complies with the entry requirements of the CGF Constitution.

The last date of the entry by NUMBER is 3 April 2010.

The last date of the Individual Entry by NAME is 3 September 2010. CGF Eligibility Conditions as detailed in Articles 24 of the CGF Constitution.

9. Dispute Resolution

Relevant disputes or protests, along with applicable appeals will be dealt with in accordance with Articles 27 and 28 of the CGF Constitution and the rules or processes defined by International Boxing Federation (AIBA).

Sport technical disputes for the Delhi 2010 Boxing competition will be addressed in accordance with the details below:

Protests against the decision of the Referees or Judges are permitted in the following cases:

- When the Referees decision is against AIBA rules, the Jury may use videotape recording when considering the incident.
- When the protesting Manager believes that the Judges have made a mistake on their Score Sheets/scoring, resulting in a wrong verdict.
- A Protest can be lodged by a Team Manager within 30 minutes after the end of the relevant boxing session. The protest has to be handed to the President of the Jury along with the appropriate protest fee. AIBA rules require a fee of US \$500. If the protest is upheld the fee will be refunded after deducting a sum of \$100/-.
- In the Finals, a Protest if any should be lodged within 5 minutes from the completion of the Bout.
- Subsequent Issues or Appeals may be dealt with by the Federation Court as detailed in Article 28 of the CGF Constitution where appropriate.
- An ad hoc Division of the Appeals Arbitration Division of the Court of Arbitration for Sport will be in operation in Melbourne for the period of the Games and the period immediately leading up to the Games.
- The Court of Arbitration for Sport will address relevant cases as directed by the Federation Court or those that fall within its charter, in accordance with Articles 28 and 30 of the CGF Constitution.

10. Competition and Training Venues

10.1 Competition Venue (Talkatora Indoor Stadium)

The Venue for the Boxing Competition is at Talkatora Indoor Stadium located in Talkatora Gardens with a seating capacity of 3,000 spectators and is approximately 12 km from the Games Village.

Travel Time

The travel time from the Sports village to the Talkatora Indoor Stadium is approximately 30 minutes.

Transport

There will be regular shuttle Buses for the Boxers from the Games Village to the Talkatora Indoor Stadium and back, plying in 15 minutes Intervals, starting 2 hours before the first Bout of the Day and transport will be provided to the Games Village 60 minutes after the last bout.

10.2 Rehearsals

There will be rehearsals before the start of competition. Rehearsals will be held three (3) days before the start of the Boxing competition .i.e 2nd October, 2010 at 1700hrs. This will assist the production of the competition and will involve Sport Presentation, Volunteer Training, Broadcast and Competition Management. Appointed Technical Officials will also be involved in a scheduled rehearsal.

Medal Ceremony Training/ rehearsals will also be held on 12th October, 2010 at 1000 hrs.

10.3 Training Venue at Delhi University

The Training Venue is situated at the North Campus of Delhi University and will be available for training from the 23rd of September till 13th October 2010.

Travel time

The distance from the Games Village to the Training Venue is approximately 12 km and it takes about 40 minutes to reach the Venue.

Transport Facilities

Shuttle buses will be provided from the Games Village to the Training Venue and back on an hourly basis. The first shuttle bus from the Games Village to the Training venue will start at 0700 hrs.

Training Venue Facilities

10.4 Training Venue Schedule, Bookings and Alterations

Each participating CGA will be allocated specific training times for the nominated Training Venue. Further information will be provided in detail in the Team Leaders Guide distributed in September, 2010.

The allocation to training time slots will be determined by Competition Management and distributed equitably across all competing CGAs.

Prior to the commencement of Competition and throughout the Competition, information relating to the training venue schedule will be coordinated through the Sport Information Centre located at the GV and displayed on Games INFO. This will include the management of requests from CGAs for alterations to the schedule, including cancellations, time changes and additional sessions.

If any Team wishes to change their Training schedule, a formal request will have to be made 48 hours in advance.

11. Technical Officials, Referees/ Judges and Medical Jury

11.1 Appointments

Jury Members, International Technical Officials Referees/ Judges and Medical Jury will be appointed by AIBA.

Jury Members, ITOs, Referees/ Judges and Medical Jury are required to ensure that the rules and regulations of the Sport are implemented in accordance with the AIBA regulations.

The number of Officials required, roles and qualifications of the Technical Officials as per AIBA Technical Regulations will be decided by AIBA.

National Technical Officials holding a National level qualification are appointed by Sports Committee of OC CWG 2010 (GTCC) in conjunction with the approval of Technical Delegate and the Indian Boxing Federation (IBF).

10.4 Referee and Judges Roster

Referee and Judges Roster will have specific roles assigned and will be done by the Jury before the Bouts, Maintaining Neutrality for the Bout. Referee and judges will be informed by the specific assignments 15 minutes before they are to officiate in a particular Bout.

10.5 Meetings

- (i) Technical Official Meeting at Talkatora Indoor stadium at 3 pm on 2nd Oct 2010.
- (ii) Team Leader's Meeting at Talkatora Indoor stadium at 4 pm on 2nd Oct 2010.

(iii) Venue Orientation at 5pm at Talkatora Indoor stadium at 5 pm on 2nd Oct 2010.

The Technical Officials Meeting will define the role and duties of the Technical Officials at the Championship. The Team Leaders will be provided the most current sports specific information.

Venue Orientation rehearsal will be held to familiarize the Team Leaders and the Technical Officials of the various functional Areas and the manner in which the competition would be run.

Each participating CGA should have a representative at the Team Leader's Meeting in attendance. Updated information will be distributed to CGAs at this meeting.

12. The Mixed Zone

The Mixed Zone is an area immediately adjacent to the 'Field of Play'. Athletes exiting the 'field of play' must move through this area where they have the option of interacting with the media across a physical barrier. The mixed zone at all venues will be divided into two clear zones: rights-holding broadcasters and written press. There will be a mixed zone Supervisor at each venue to ensure the smooth running of this facility. The Games INFO/News team will also operate in this area in order to post flash interview quotes onto the Games INFO system.
