Some changes may occur if deemed necessary by the Technical Delegate on behalf of the ITTF or Delhi 2010 upon receipt of final by name. Any such changes will be communicated to participating CGAs in the Team Leaders Guides distributed prior to Games time, or at the Sport Technical Briefing.

3. Commendation

3.1 Victory Ceremonies

Victory Ceremonies shall be held shortly after the completion of the event.

Medal – Winner must wear his / her official CGA uniform.

Prizes shall be given as follows:

3.2 Singles

- First Prize: Gold Medal and a Diploma for the winner.
- Second Prize: Silver Medal and a Diploma for the athlete placed second.
- Third Prize: Bronze Medal and a Diploma for the athlete placed third.

3.3 Team event – Doubles – Mixed doubles

- First Prize: Gold Medal and a Diploma for each member of the winning team or pair.
- Second Prize: Silver Medal and a Diploma for each member of the team or pair placed second.
- Third Prize: Bronze Medal and a Diploma for each member of the team or pair placed third.

3.4 Women's Open singles (TT 1-5)

- First Prize: Gold medal and a Diploma for the winner.
- Second Prize: Silver medal and a Diploma for the athlete placed second.
- Third Prize: Bronze medal and a Diploma for the athlete placed third.

Gold, Silver and Bronze Medals will be awarded in all events where at least six CGAs are represented, in accordance with the CGF Constitution. A play off for the bronze medal will be held in all events.

4. Rules and Regulations

The Delhi 2010 Table Tennis competition will be conducted in accordance with the rules and regulations of the ITTF.

5. Table Tennis Equipment

ITTF approved sport equipment will be used for the Delhi 2010 Table Tennis competition:

- Tables (wheelchair compliant)
- Nets
- 3 star white balls
- Synthetic flooring (red in colour)
- Court Barriers

6. Athlete Team Uniform

During competition, each athlete is expected to compete in their official CGA team uniform.

Athletes must comply with Regulation 11 of the CGF Constitution, noting the rules relating to identification on personal competition clothing and personal equipment.

It is imperative that Table Tennis athletes display their name and nation on the back of their competition uniform. Athletes should attend all medal ceremonies in their official CGA team tracksuit wearing the top and the trousers.

7. Entries, Seeds & Draw

The Sport Entry process is detailed in the Sport Handbook. All entries must be submitted in accordance with the D2010 Sport Entry Pack, which complies with the entry requirements of the CGF Constitution. The close of Individual Entry forms by name for all sports is no later than 3rd September 2010. All athletes must also be able to meet CGF Eligibility Conditions as detailed in Articles 24 and 25 of the CGF Constitution.

8. Ranking and Seeding

The following methods will be used for ranking and seeding purposes:

8.1 Men's and Women's Singles Events

Latest World ranking issued by the ITTF at the time of draw.

8.2 All Doubles Events

Draft ranking will be done and then be sent to the Chairman, ITTF Ranking Committee for final ranking.

8.3 Teams Events

The ITTF method for calculating team rankings will be used, but applied only to those athletes present at the Games, not the published ITTF country rankings. The world ranking of the 3 highest ranked players present will be used for this calculation.

9. Para - Sport Classification and Rules

9.1 As all athletes participating will have an International Classification Card, there will be no classifiers present at the Delhi 2010 Commonwealth Games. Should a participating nation wish to submit a protest, this should be sent to the ITTF PTT Classification Secretary and this may be considered at the next relevant international event..

9.2 The competition will be run in accordance with ITTF rules read in conjunction with the ITTF PTT rules with exceptions to be advised.

10. Wheelchair and Prosthesis Repairs

Repairs to prosthesis and wheelchairs will be coordinated through the Polyclinic. All requests for repairs should be through the Polyclinic. Limited repair facilities will be available on site.

11. Competition Format

11.1 Team

Team events for men and women will be played under the new Swaythling Cup system with a team consisting of 3 players. A maximum of 5 individual matches will be played in each team match as follows:

A v X

B v Y

C v Z

A v Y

B v X

Each individual team match will be best of 5 games. The team match will end when one team has won 3 individual matches. The competition will be conducted with qualifying groups of 4 or 5 teams with 2 teams progressing to the main second stage draw which will be played on a progressive knock out basis. All other teams will progress to play classification matches to produce a final ranking.

11.2 Singles

The singles events will be played as a round robin to knock out (subject to the number of entries) as follows:

Men's and Women's Singles

Athletes will be divided into groups of 3 or 4 (one player from each group progresses) plus 16 seeds into the knock out phase to a round of 64 knock out. In the qualifying groups matches will be best of 7 unless the size of entry means that this has to be changed to best of 5 games.

Women's Wheelchair Singles –

Athletes will be divided into pools for a single round robin qualifying phase with a maximum of five (5) athletes in each pool. The actual number of pools and athletes in each pool will be determined and communicated following the close of final individual entries.

The top two (2) athletes in each pool following the completion of the qualifying phase will qualify and progress to the knock-out phase.

11.3 Doubles

Men's doubles, women's doubles and mixed doubles will be played on a straight knock out basis. All matches will be best of 5 games.

12. Timing, Scoring & Results

(TBC) agency appointed as the TSR provider for the Delhi 2010 Commonwealth Games. (TBC) is responsible for the full delivery of Timing, Scoring & Results services for all sports as part of the total turnkey contract and sponsorship agreement.

Assistant umpires will keep score using the normal manual scoring device. Alongside each court there will be a computer controlled scoring device operated by a volunteer that will feed the electronic scoreboard at the end of each court and the central results system.

The CM is responsible for the planning, organisation, management and conduct of the Table Tennis competition and related services.

e. **Deputy Competition Manager**

The Deputy Competition Manager (DCM) is to assist the CM in the planning, organisation, management of the Table Tennis competition and at Games time manage all the Non-Field of Play (FOP) functions.

f. **FOP/Operations Manager**

The FOP/Operations Manager (FOPM) is to assist the CM in the planning, organisation, management of the Table Tennis competition, the procurement and installation of the Sports Equipment, and at Games time manage all the FOP functions.

13.7 Administrative Assistant

The Admin Assistant (AA) will provide administrative support to the Table Tennis Competition Management.

14. Dispute Resolution

Relevant disputes or protests, along with applicable appeals will be dealt with in accordance with Articles 28 and 30 of the CGF Constitution and the rules or processes defined by ITTF.

Sport technical disputes for the Delhi 2010 Table Tennis competition will be addressed in through Competition Management to the Jury.

Subsequent issues or appeals may be dealt with by the Federation Court as detailed in Article 28 of the CGF Constitution where appropriate.

An ad hoc Division of the Appeals Arbitration Division of the Court of Arbitration for Sport will be in operation in Delhi for the period of the Games and the period immediately leading up to the Games. The Court of Arbitration for Sport will address relevant cases as directed by the Federation Court or those that fall within its charter, in accordance with Articles 28 and 30 of the CGF Constitution

15. Competition and Training Venues

Yamuna Sports Complex (YSC), Delhi

15.1 Venue facilities

- The Show Court area: Two Tables - 8.40 X 16.80 M area for each Table,
- The Match Court area: Eight Tables - 7 X 14 M for each Table
- The Warm Up / Training Area :Ten Tables - 7 X 14 M / Eighteen Tables 6 X 12M for each Table
- Wheelchair accessible tables not less than 8m long and 6m wide.
- Floor surface – ITTF approved synthetic flooring - Red in Colour.
- Barriers (court surrounds) – 750 MM high x 1.20/1.40 M long.
- Lighting for the Show Court Table – 2200 lux .
- Lighting for the Match Court Tables 1500 lux .
- Lighting for the Warm up / Training Tables 750 lux.
- FOP Branding is subject to strict ITTF limitations (refer www.ittf.com).

16. Training Venue

- Yamuna Sports Complex
- Jamia Milia University

Training will be held only at the competition venue, YSC and Jamia Milia. CGA Access to training venues is governed by the D2010 Policy

17. Pre Games Training Schedule

17.1 Booking Procedure

Pre Games training times and Tables will be assigned by Competition Management following the receipt of preferences from CGAs and

subsequently from competing teams/athletes through the Sports Information Desk at the Village.

17.2 Games time Training Schedule

No Games time training schedule will be produced. Refer item 15.1 for training court usage. During the Team Events certain times will be allocated where non-team athletes (individual and Para athletes) get priority for training courts. These times will be identified by CM but generally begin at the start time of the last Teams match in each session and finish approximately 1 ½ hours before the start of the next session.

Athletes eliminated from the competition may continue to train on the Training Courts up until 14th October 2010 although court priority is given to athletes remaining in the competition.

18. Workforce Requirements

Pre Games the training venues area at YSC and Jamia Milia University will be staffed with Training Venue Supervisor supported by SSV's.

19. Equipment and Consumables

The Training Court area at YSC will be set up with 10 – 18 Table Tennis Tables of the same brand as the Match Courts. Balls (the same as match balls) will be provided sparingly. At Jamia Milia University 4 Tables will be available for trainees.

20. Technical Officials

a. Technical Officials Appointments

Technical Officials appointed by ITTF are required to ensure that the ITTF rules and regulations of the sport are implemented.

The number required, roles and qualifications of Technical Officials have been identified by the ITTF.
