Some changes may occur if deemed necessary by the Technical Delegate on behalf of the ITF or Delhi 2010, upon receipt of final individual entries.

Any such changes will be communicated to participating CGAs in the Team Leaders Guides distributed prior to Games time, or at the Team Managers Briefing.

3. Commendation

Victory Ceremonies

Victory Ceremonies shall be held shortly after the completion of the event. Medal – Winner must wear their official CGA uniform.

Prizes shall be given as follows:

3.1 Singles:

- First Prize: Gold medal and a Diploma for the winner.
- Second Prize: Silver medal and a Diploma for the athlete placed second.
- Third Prize: Bronze medal and a Diploma for the athlete placed third.

3.2 Mixed Doubles Competition –Men’s Doubles-Women’s Doubles

- First Prize: Gold medal and a Diploma for each member of the winning team.

- Second Prize: Silver medal and a Diploma for each member of the team placed second.
- Third Prize: Bronze medal and a Diploma for each member of the team placed third.
- A play off for the third Prize (Bronze Medal) will be held in all events

Gold, silver and bronze medals will be awarded in all events where at least six CGAs are represented, in accordance with the CGF Constitution. A play off for the bronze medal will be held in all events.

4. Competition Rules and Regulations

The Delhi 2010 Tennis competition will be conducted in accordance with the rules and regulations of the ITF and with such other provisions as the Commonwealth Games Federation (CGF) may stipulate.

The ITF website www.itftennis.com provides a copy of the latest ITF Constitution, Laws and Regulations for competition.

5. Sport Equipment

The following sport equipment will be used for the Delhi 2010 Tennis competition:

- ITF approved Court Surface
- ITF approved Nets and Net Posts
- ITF approved Tennis balls
- Re-stringing machines

Rehearsals

There will be rehearsals at the venue before the start of competition. This will assist with the production of each competition and will involve Sport Presentation, Volunteer Training, Broadcast and Competition Management. Appointed Technical Officials may also be involved in a scheduled rehearsal.

6. Athlete Team Uniform

During competition, each athlete is expected to compete in their official CGA team uniform.

Athletes clothing and personal equipment must comply with the GFS10 of the CGF Games Family Services Manual.

Tennis athletes must also comply with the following requirements, as determined by the ITF:

- Please refer to "Appendix E of the draft 2010 CWG Regulations, Code of Conduct, article C "Dress and Equipment"."
- Delhi 2010 will apply Regulations 20 and 22 pertaining to 'Open Events'.

Athletes should attend all medal ceremonies in their official CGA team tracksuit and appropriate footwear, even where the medal ceremony is scheduled for a different day to the day of competition.

7. Entries, Seeds & Draw

The Sport Entry process is detailed in the Sport Entry Pack. All entries must be submitted in accordance with the D2010 Sport Entry Pack, which complies with the entry requirements of the CGF Constitution. The close of individual Entry forms by name for the sport is no later than 3rd September, 2010. All athletes must also be able to meet CGF Eligibility Conditions as detailed in Articles 24 of the CGF Constitution.

Number of Entries –Individual Competition

Each CGA shall be entitled to enter the following maximum number of entries in the Individual events. Subject to not exceeding a maximum of four men and four women athletes representing any one CGA and a maximum of 2 doubles teams may compete in doubles event. Maximum of two teams per nation may enter the Mixed Doubles event

Men's Singles	3 competitors – 32 Draw
Women's Singles	3 competitors – 32 Draw
Men's Doubles	Two pairs – 16 Team Draw
Women's Doubles	Two pairs – 16 Team Draw
Mixed Doubles	Two pairs – 16 Team Draw

Seeds and Draw

Individual Competition

Singles Event

26 players will qualify directly as Direct acceptances based on the recognized Singles World Rankings of **Monday 2 August 2010**. 6 ITF places will be allocated by the ITF based on the recognized Singles World rankings and the Continental / CGA representation. The seedings will be decided by the ITF.

Doubles Event

13 teams will qualify as Direct acceptances based on best combined Singles/doubles world rankings of **Monday 2 August 2010**. 3 ITF places will be allocated to teams by the ITF based on the best combined Singles/Doubles World rankings and the Continental / NOC representation. The seedings will be decided by the ITF.

8. Competition Format

9. Competition Procedures

Appointment of Team Manager

Each competing CGA shall appoint a Manager of the team; the name of the Manager shall be notified to the Referee.

From the time of arrival at the venue, the Manager shall assume all administrative and other responsibilities on behalf of the team concerned in connection with the conduct of the competition.

The Team Manager shall attend any briefing meeting called by the Referee. Failure to do so may render a team liable to disqualification, at the Referee's discretion.

10. Competition Management Team

The current Competition Management team that has been assembled for the Delhi 2010 Tennis competition is as follows:

Additional appointments will be made prior to Games time to deliver the Tennis competition. A full competition management structure will be provided in the Team Leaders Guide distributed prior to Games time.

Technical Delegate Appointment & Responsibilities

The role of the Technical Delegate for Tennis includes responsibility for:

- The Tennis Competition Schedule
- Approval of sport equipment to be used in competition
- All elements of the Field of Play (FOP)
- Signage and LOOK elements of the FOP, in accordance with International Federation rules
- Management of appointed Technical Officials
- Approval of the Timing, Scoring and Results Delivery Plan
- Training venues

11. Timing, Scoring & Results

Swiss Timing has been appointed as the “Official Timekeeper” for the Delhi 2010 Commonwealth Games and is responsible for the full delivery of Timing, Scoring & Results services for all sports as part of the total turnkey contract and sponsorship agreement.

12. Dispute Resolution

Relevant disputes or protests, along with applicable appeals will be dealt with in accordance with Articles 27 and 28 of the CGF Constitution and the rules or processes defined by each International Federation.

Sport Technical Disputes for the Delhi 2010 Tennis competition will be addressed in accordance with the relevant ITF Rules & Regulations as follows:

- Competitors are subject to the ITF's Players' Code of Conduct as set out in Appendix 4 of the ITF's Competition Regulations.
- The ITF's Disciplinary Regulations as set out in the Statute Book subject to any amendments in force at the time that apply to the Delhi 2010 Tennis competition.
- Any protest during the Games must be lodged in writing with the Referee who may take such action as he considers appropriate in the circumstances.

The Organising Committee shall have the power to disqualify at any stage of the competition;

- Any team which has failed to carry out its obligations or breaches the Rules and Regulations of the CGF.
- A player, or a team that includes a player, breaching the Doping Control Regulations

Subsequent issues or appeals may be dealt with by the Federation Court as detailed in Article 28 of the CGF Constitution where appropriate.

An ad hoc Division of the Appeals Arbitration Division of the Court of Arbitration for Sport will be in operation in Delhi for the period of the Games and the period immediately leading up to the Games. The Court of Arbitration for Sport will address relevant cases as directed by the Federation Court or those that fall within its charter, in accordance with Article 28 of the CGF Constitution.

13. Competition and Training Venues

Competition Venue: R.K. Khanna Tennis Stadium

R.K. Khanna Tennis Stadium will host the 2010 CWG Tennis Competition. The Venue accommodates 14 Tennis Courts.

Key venue information includes:

- Athletes will be allowed granted access to train on the competition courts 3 days prior to the commencement of competition i.e. on 1st .2nd and 3rd October, 2010.

Training Venues:

- R.K. Khanna Tennis Stadium (6 Courts)
- Siri Fort DDA Sports Complex (9 Courts)

14. Technical Officials

Technical Officials are required to ensure that the rules and regulations of the sport are implemented in accordance with ITF.

The number required roles and qualifications of Technical Officials have been identified by the ITF. The appointment of internationally qualified Technical Officials has also been coordinated by the ITF, in conjunction with the CGF.

Technical Officials requiring a national level qualification as determined by the ITF have been appointed by Delhi 2010 in conjunction with the Indian Commonwealth Games Association.

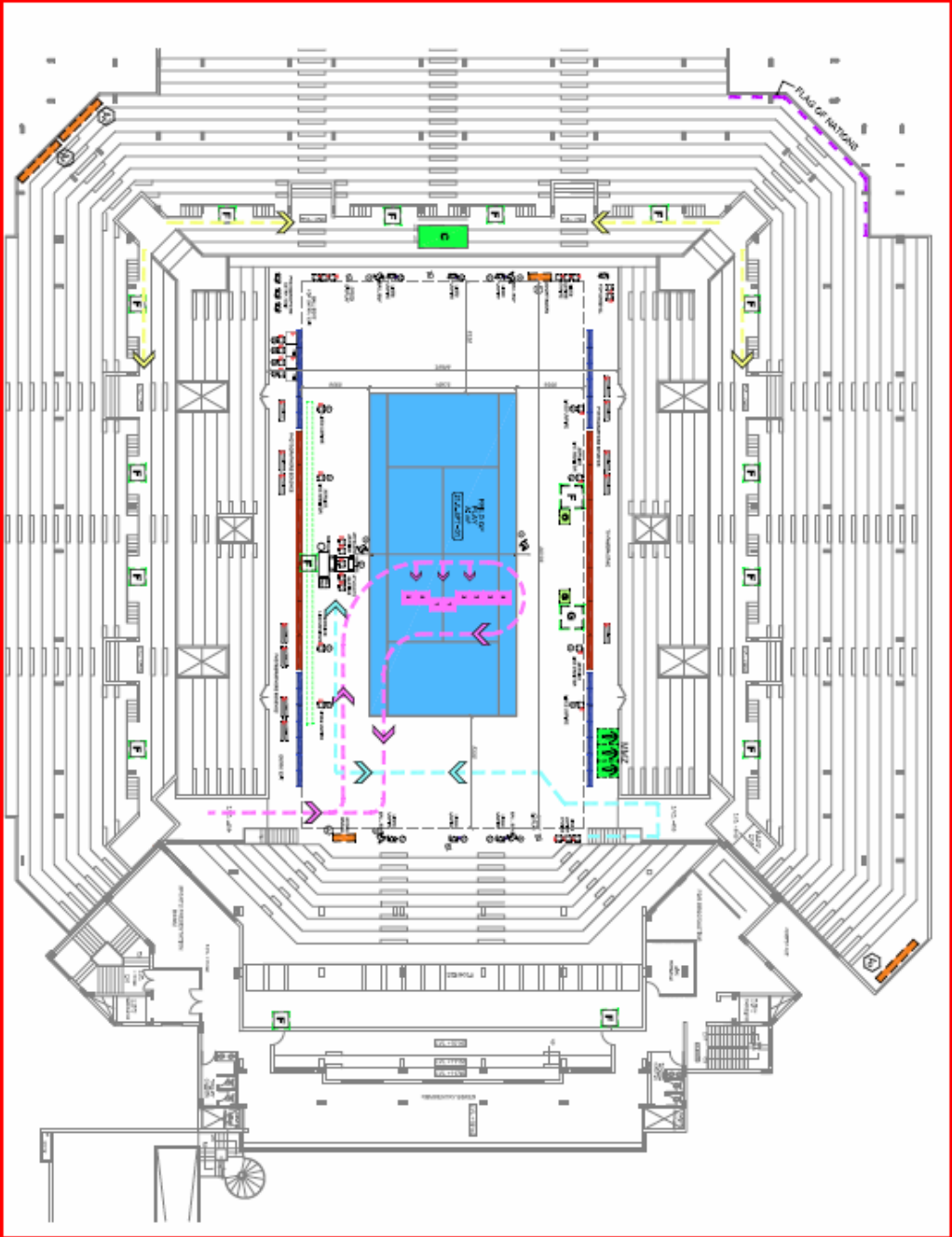
