



INTERNATIONAL RADIO NEWS ACCESS RULES APPLICABLE TO THE DELHI 2010 COMMONWEALTH GAMES

INTRODUCTION

Delhi 2010 has granted (or intends to grant) organisations the exclusive right to broadcast the Delhi 2010 Commonwealth Games on radio in specific territories world-wide. When exclusive rights to broadcast the Commonwealth Games on radio are granted in a particular territory, no other organisation may broadcast on radio any Commonwealth Games Event in that territory, except as permitted by the News Access Rules as set out below or as otherwise authorised by Delhi 2010.

These News Access Rules only apply to radio broadcasting and do not apply to the broadcast or transmission of Commonwealth Games Events via any other media, including, without limitation, television, internet and mobile telephony devices.

These News Access Rules are subject to national laws and regulations. In appropriate cases, Delhi 2010 may issue supplementary news access rules for particular territories. In the event of inconsistency, those supplementary rules will take precedence in that territory over these international News Access Rules.

BROADCASTING

1. Non Rights-holders may broadcast Games Material on radio in their territory provided that they comply with the following News Access Rules.
2. Games Material may only be used as a part of News Programs. The News Programs must not be positioned or promoted as Commonwealth Games programs and the Games Material component must not be sponsored.
3. News Programs in which Games Material is used must be separated by at least 55 minutes.
4. Non Rights-holders must not broadcast play-by-play commentary or similar coverage of any Games Material, whether on a live or delayed basis, or any other material obtained while inside a Games Venue, including interviews, except with respect to Official Delhi 2010 Press Conferences as described in paragraph 8 below.
5. Non Rights-holders must not broadcast any Games Material in their territory, unless that Games Material has already been broadcast by a Rights holder in their territory.
6. Non Rights-holders must cease broadcasting Games Material 48 hours after the earliest time at which broadcasts of such Games Material may begin.
7. Games Material shall not be used by any Non Rights-holder in any promotion whatsoever, including without limitation, in promotions of any News Program within which it is broadcast.
8. Subject to paragraph 9, Non Rights-holders may broadcast sound of all or portions of any Official Delhi 2010 Media Conference held at the MPC, with a delay of at least 30 minutes from the conclusion of the respective Official Delhi 2010 Media Conference.
9. Non Rights-holders may not originate programming or feed from the MPC and/or any Games Venue.

OBTAINING GAMES MATERIAL

10. Non Rights-holders may record Games Material directly 'off-air' with the agreement of the Rights Holder in their respective territory.

GENERAL OBLIGATIONS

11. Non Rights-holders must ensure that:
 - (a) they do not make available or provide Games Material to any third party without the express prior written consent of Delhi 2010,
 - (b) no advertising or other message is placed before, during or after the broadcast of Games Material in such a manner as to suggest sponsorship, approval or affiliation between a third party, or third party's product or service, and Games Material or the Commonwealth Games; and
 - (c) Rights holders are credited for the use of the Games Material in each broadcast.

ACCREDITATION

12. Each Non Rights-holder will be entitled to seek ENR accreditation for its personnel, who, if accredited by Delhi 2010 (in its absolute discretion) will have access:
 - (a) without equipment to:
 - (i) all sessions at competition venues except for those listed as ticketed high-demand sessions (ie PEL Events); and
 - (ii) the international zone of the Commonwealth Games Village, provided that a media pass has been obtained; and
 - (b) with equipment, to all Official Delhi 2010 Media Conferences at the MPC, provided that they comply with the restrictions set out in paragraphs 8 and 9.
13. The grant of accreditation is subject to the Non Rights-holders acknowledging and agreeing to the following terms:
 - (a) that access to Games Venues will be subject to accreditation and security procedures which shall be developed and implemented by Delhi 2010 in its absolute discretion;
 - (b) that any application for accreditation shall be made in such form as is required by Delhi 2010 in its absolute discretion and that nothing in these News Access Rules compromises or fetters Delhi 2010's absolute discretion in relation to the accreditation of individuals;
 - (c) that Delhi 2010 is not obliged to grant accreditation to any person or class of persons and that Delhi 2010 may in its absolute discretion exercise at any time the right to (i) grant accreditation, (ii) grant accreditation with conditions, (iii) refuse accreditation, (iv) cancel accreditation, and (v) refuse entry by any individuals to Games Venues;
 - (d) that Non Rights-holders must ensure that their personnel at all times follow the Delhi 2010 accreditation and security procedures in force from time to time;
 - (e) the Non Rights-holders executing an agreement to fully comply with all terms and conditions of these News Access Rules and to fully comply with any terms and conditions of access to a Games Venue, whether through the issue of a ticket, an accreditation or otherwise.
14. Accreditation shall not entitle a Non Rights-holder to originate any programming or feed from any Games Venue.
15. Delhi 2010 reserves the right to withdraw the accreditation of any person without notice, at the discretion of Delhi 2010, in order to enforce compliance with these News Access Rules or with Delhi 2010's accreditation and security procedures.

APPLICATION OF THE NEWS ACCESS RULES

16. These News Access Rules shall come into effect from the date when a Commonwealth Games accreditation is required to obtain access into any of the Games Venues and shall continue until 17

October 2010 (inclusive). During their operation, the News Access Rules shall be monitored and enforced by Delhi 2010 management. The Delhi 2010 Executive Board shall be the final authority with respect to the interpretation and implementation of these News Access Rules.

DEFINITIONS

“Commonwealth Games” means the XIX Commonwealth Games to be held principally in Delhi in 2010.

“Commonwealth Games Event/s” means the events held as part of the Commonwealth Games, including, without limitation, all sporting competitions, the opening, closing and medal ceremonies, and all other activities occurring at Games Venues.

“Commonwealth Games related indicia and images” includes any indicia, images, trade marks, service marks, copyrights, designs, mascots, logos, pictograms, designations, insignia or other intellectual property rights that relate to or are in any way connected with the Commonwealth Games, Delhi 2010, ICGT or the Indian Commonwealth Games Team.

“Commonwealth Games Village” means the area set aside for the board and lodging of the athletes, officials, trainers and other participants in the Commonwealth Games, and includes a residential zone and an international zone.

“Delhi 2010” means Organising Committee Commonwealth Games 2010 Delhi, a society registered under the Societies Registration Act for the primary purpose of planning, organising and delivering the Commonwealth Games.

“Games Material” means sound and/or descriptions of any Commonwealth Games Events.

“Games Venues” includes all venues where Commonwealth Games Events are held, and includes without limitation, the Commonwealth Games Village, the MPC, competition venues, training venues, other venues at which medal presentations take place during the time that the medal presentations actually take place and venues which require Games accreditation or a ticket to gain entry.

“Indian Commonwealth Games Team” means the team of athletes selected by the IOA to represent India at the Games.

“IOA” means the Indian Olympic Association.

“MPC” means the Main Press Centre as designated by Delhi 2010 and includes the Main Media Conference Room.

“News Access Rules” means the rules as set out in this document, and as amended by Delhi 2010 from time to time.

“News Programs” means regularly scheduled daily radio news programs of which the actual news element constitutes the main feature.

“Non Rights-holder” means any broadcaster which has not been granted exclusive rights by Delhi 2010 to broadcast the Commonwealth Games.

“Official Delhi 2010 Media Conference” means a media conference which is designated by M2006 as an official Delhi 2010 media conference and for the avoidance of doubt excludes sports specific press conferences at the MPC.

“PEL Events” means prime event limitation events which will subject to high demand (eg swimming).

“Rights Holder” means the corporation/s who have been granted the exclusive right by Delhi 2010 to broadcast the Commonwealth Games in a particular territory.
