General Information

China in Brief

China is one of the world's most ancient civilizations with rich material and cultural heritages that trace back a history of over 5,000 years. As the world's largest developing country, China has accomplished enormous economic and social progress for which it is acclaimed by the world. Nowadays, China enjoys political and social stability and fast economic growth, and its people's living standards keep improving.

Geography

China is situated in East Asia on the western coast of the Pacific. With a land area of 9.6 million square kilometers, China has a highly varied terrain that in general slopes downward from the west to the east.

Climate

China has highly varied climate conditions across its vast territory. Most parts of the country are within the North Temperate Zone, typical of a continental monsoon climate, featuring moderate weather conditions and distinct four seasons.

Population, Ethnicity and Language

Population: 1,328,020,000

Ethnicity: China is a multi-ethnic country with 56 different ethnic groups.



Language: Over 80 different languages are spoken in China, about 30 of which have written forms. Putonghua (Mandarin) is the official language of China.

Religion

Religion: China is a country with multi-religions mainly including Buddhism, Taoism, Islam, Catholics and Christianity. Chinese citizens enjoy the freedom of religious belief.

Miscellaneous

Currency: Renminbi (RMB) is the legal currency of China. The fractional currency is jiao and fen. One yuan is composed of 10 jiao and one jiao is composed of 10 fen. Foreign currencies can be exchanged at most hotels and banks in China.

Guangdong Province in Brief

Geographic Location

The Guangdong Province covers a land area of 179,800 square kilometers between 20°13' – 25°31'N and 109°39' – 117°19'E on the southern end of the Chinese mainland. Situated to the north of the South China Sea, Guangdong Province has a coastline of 3,368.1 kilometers.

Climate

Guangdong Province has a mixture of tropical and subtropical monsoon climates, with an annual average temperature of 22.3 Celsius degrees, featuring prolonged summer and warm winter. Guangdong is a humid province, as the rainfall averages between 1,300mm and 2,500mm annually. The low altitude and the ocean also have a great impact on the local climate.

Population and Language

Population: 94,490,000

Language: Three dialect phyla in addition to Putonghua.

Guangzhou in Brief

Administrative Districts and Population

As the capital of Guangdong Province, Guangzhou is the political, economic, and cultural center of the province. It is also a major trading hub of China.

Covering an area of 7,434.4 square kilometers and with a resident population of nearly 10 million, Guangzhou administrates 10 districts and two county-level cities, Conghua and Zengcheng.

Touristic Resources

Guangzhou enjoys rich touristic resources. There are more than 100 scenic sites.

The famous Eight Top Scenic Spots of Guangzhou: Baiyun



Mountain, Pearl River, Yuexiu Mountain, East Station Square, Chen Clan Academy, Huanghuagang Mausoleum of 72 Martyrs, Guangdong Olympic Sports Center and Lotus Mountain.

Other famous scenic sites include Dr. Sun Yat-sen Memorial Hall, Huangpu Military Academy, Western Han Nanyue King Museum, Guangzhou International Convention and Exhibition Center, Guangzhou Museum of Art, South China Botanical Garden, Conghua Hot Spring, Liuxi River National Forest Park, Up Down Nine Pedestrian Street, and Beijing Road Pedestrian Street, etc.

History and Culture

Guangzhou is a famous cultural city with a history of more than 2,200 years. In the year of 214 B.C. , Nanhai Prefecture (the Capital was built in “Panyu”) was founded. In the year of 226 A. D. , the city was named “Guangzhou”.

Guangzhou was the starting point of the “Maritime Silk Road” and was the earliest trade port in China. The city is also a cradle of modern Chinese revolution.

Cantonese Opera is a typical local opera. It is popular in Guangdong Province, Hong Kong, Macau and Southeast Asia. Lingnan painting school is one of China’s modern painting schools. Guangzhou’s carvings, porcelains and ceramics, and embroideries are fine art crafts famous both at home and abroad. Cantonese cuisine is one of the major cuisines in China.

It is rich in popular customs such as Spring Flower Festival, dragon boat racing, mountain climbing in the Double Ninth Festival, morning tea, etc.

The Emblem

The official emblem of the 16th Asian Games was designed based on the contours of the Statue of the Five Goats, the symbol of Guangzhou. Its soft lines move upward to form the silhouette of the Statue, which also resembles the flame in the caldron of the 16th Asian Games. The design well embodies the symbol of Guangzhou, representing the goodwill of the Guangzhou people and the dynamics of the Asian Games.

The Mascots

Named “*Le Yangyang*” as a group, the Mascots of the 16th Asian Games are five sporty and cute goats called *A Xiang* [a: 'sj ʌ ŋ], *A He* [a: 'hə:], *A Ru* [a: 'ru:], *A Yi* [a: 'ji:] and *Le Yangyang* ['lə: j ʌ ŋj ʌ ŋ] respectively. Put together, these names mean “peace, fortune and happiness”. They express the goodwill that Guangzhou hopes to bring to Asia through the 16th Asian Games; fortune, harmony, happiness, fulfillment and joy; and also convey the Games’ message - harmony and passion.

The Asian Games Town

The Asian Games Town covers a planned area of 2.73 square kilometers on the east side of Guangzhou New Town, right at the foot of the Lotus Mountain and alongside the Lotus Waterway. Well-equipped and set in a beautiful environment, the Asian Games Town comprises the Athletes’ Village, the Media Village, the International Broadcast Center, the Main Press Center and the Asian Games Park.

Accreditation and Validation

GAGOC will start distributing the accreditation application forms and Users' Guide from March 15, 2010.

The completed accreditation application forms shall be returned to GAGOC by June 30, 2010.

From September 1, 2010, GAGOC will start sending out the accreditation cards of the 16th Asian Games to NOCs that have submitted valid accreditation application forms with photos before June 30, 2010. The bearers of the accreditation cards can activate the accreditation cards at the accreditation centers at the airport or the Asian Games Town /the sub-villages upon entering China. Once activated, the accreditation cards will be used as the official IDs for participation in the 16th Asian Games. The bearers have access rights to different venues and zones according to the access entitlement specified on their accreditation cards.

Immigration / Visa

From October 13 to December 12, 2010, AGIAC holders will be permitted multiple entries into China upon presentation of their AGIAC, together with a valid passport or other valid international travel documents. Card holders will not need to apply for a China Visa or Residence Permit in order to enter the country. Any AGIAC holders wishing to enter China before or after the validity period of the AGIAC, or remain in China after its expiry date, will need to make their own arrangements regarding visas or



residence permit.

AGIAC holders should ensure that the information on their valid passport or international travel documents when entering China is exactly the same with the information on the certified document used for application for AGIAC, and that their passport or travel document remain valid at least till May 31, 2011.

Transportation

Transport Services for Arrival and Departure

Provision of shuttle bus services for athletes and team officials between designated sites and their accommodations during the arrival and departure period of the Games. Provision of group bus services for arriving or departing athletes and team officials. The group bus services require advance reservation.

Dedicated Bus Services for Team Events (for team events)

Provision of dedicated group bus services for athletes' teams participating in team events for training and competition. These group bus services require reservation and confirmation.

Transport Services for Competitions (for non-team events)

Provision of shuttle bus services for athletes and team officials participating in non-team events between their accommodations and the applicable competition venues as per the competition schedule.

Transport Services for Training (for non-team events)

Provision of shuttle bus services for athletes and team officials participating in non-team events between their accommodations and the training venues as per the training schedule. These services will stop at 1:00pm on the day of the Opening Ceremony. Athletes who wish to continue to train until later on that day may use an NOC Dedicated Vehicle for their trips to and from the training venues.

Transport Services for Spectating

Provision of shuttle bus services for athletes and team officials as spectators between the Athletes' Village and all competition venues as per the competition schedule. Athletes and team officials as spectators of an event or events of their own sports are permitted to use the competition bus service to the applicable venue. However, priority will be given to competing athletes and their team officials.

Transport Services for Luggage

The luggage belonging to athletes and team officials should, in principle, be carried by the bus they take. If that is impossible, due to insufficient storage space, a separate vehicle will be provided to transport these items to their destinations.

Transport Services between Villages

Provision of shuttle bus services between the Athletes' Sub-villages and the Athletes' Village while the Athletes' Sub-villages are open.



Accommodation

During the Games time, over 10,000 athletes and team officials will be accommodated in the Athletes' Village which boasts 49 apartment buildings consisting of 3,598 apartments. The Athletes' Village will be officially opened on November 5, 2010 and closed on November 30, 2010. It is divided into the Public Area, the International Area and the Residential Area. Separate accreditation is required for entering the three areas.

Media

Mixed Zones

Mixed zones will be set up in the competition venues to facilitate interactions between athletes and the media. As per the requirements of the OCA, athletes must pass through the mixed zones after finishing their competitions, but are not obligated to take the media's questions. Each journalist should complete his or her interview within one minute.

AFs and the competition management teams will provide necessary assistance to ensure that athletes can pass through the mixed zone smoothly.

Press Conference

Generally, a press conference will be organized immediately after each final for the medalists (and coaches/other athletes, if necessary) to meet with the media. The media operation team will usher the participants into the press room. The press

conference will be interpreted in English and Chinese.

Medical Services

All competition and non-competition venues will include athlete medical stations, where professional medical staff as well as ambulances will stand by. The centers provide first-aid service during the period when the competition/training venues are open.

The Asian Games Town will have a polyclinic, providing treatment and consultation across the departments of internal medicine and surgery, including ophthalmology, stomatology, physical treatment, massage, X-rays, pharmacy, etc. It also has an emergency room open 24 hours a day, with ambulances stand-by. Any patients who need further diagnosis and treatment will be transferred to designated hospitals of the Games.

Free medical services will be provided to members of the Asian Games Family during the Games time.

Competition Rules

The competition is conducted in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of Federation Equestre Internationale (FEI) in force during the Games time. Any unforeseen cases not covered by the regulations shall be resolved in accordance with the Olympic Council of Asia (OCA) Constitution, Rules and Regulations.

The events will be organised in accordance with:

- FEI Statutes, 22nd Edition, effective from 15th April, 2007, updated on 21st November, 2009
- FEI General Regulations, 23rd Edition, effective from 1st January, 2009
- FEI Veterinary Regulations, 11th Edition, effective from 1st January, 2009
- FEI Dressage Rules, 23rd Edition, effective from 1st January,



2009

—FEI Eventing Rules, 23rd Edition, effective from 1st January, 2009, updated on 14th April, 2009

—FEI Jumping Rules, 23rd Edition, effective from 1st January, 2009

—Equine Anti-Doping and Medication Control Rules (EADMCR), 1st Edition, effective from 1st January, 2007, updated on 10th April, 2009

—FEI Anti-Doping Rules for Human Athletes (ADRHA), 2nd Edition, effective from 1st January, 2009

All subsequent corrections and modifications as published by the FEI with its provisions, will take precedence.

Technical matters shall be resolved in accordance with FEI Rules and Regulations. In the event of a matter remaining unresolved, a decision shall be reached by the Technical Delegates and Ground Jury following joint deliberations.

Competition Format

Dressage

Each participating NOC can enter a maximum of four (4) rider/horse combinations (with no reserved horse as substitution) with the best three results to count for the team classification.

All Individual competitors must participate in the Team competition, which counts as the Dressage Individual Qualifier.

Dressage Team

In the Dressage Team competition, the classification will be decided by adding together the percentage scores of the three best placed riders of each team. The team with the highest total percentage scores will be declared the winner. The team with the second highest total percentage scores will be awarded the second place, and so on. In the event of a tie for the first three placing, the winning team is the team whose lowest placed rider from the three has the best result. In case the teams are still tie, the team with the higher total marks/percentage of the two lowest placed riders of the three is better placed.

Dressage Individual

The Individual Competition consists of two rounds:

—The FEI Young Riders Prix St-Georges Competition Test is limited to and compulsory for the (25) best placed rider/horse combinations, including those tied for 25th in the FEI Young Riders Preliminary Competition Test.

—Each participating NOC can enter a maximum of three (3) riders for the Individual Round A.

—The FEI Young Riders Freestyle to Music is the individual



final, which is limited to and compulsory for the 15 best placed rider/horse combinations, including those tied for the 15th, of the FEI Young Riders Prix St-Georges Competition Test.

—Each participating NOC can enter a maximum of 2 riders in the individual final.

The final classification for Dressage Individual will be decided by adding together the percentage scores attained in the Individual Competition Round A and Round B. The rider with the highest total percentage score will be declared the winner, and so on. In the event of a tie for the top three placing, the rider with the higher artistic marks in round B will win. Should the artistic marks be the same, the marks for Harmony will decide the winner. In the event of ties in the remaining placing, the rider will be given the same placing.

Eventing

The competitions are conducted as an FEI CCI * event. Each NOC can enter a team with a maximum of five (5) riders/horses combinations and a minimum of three (3) riders/horses combinations with no reserved riders or horses as substitution.

All riders and horses must be qualified as per FEI rules for CCI one star Regional championship.

Horses that had participated in 4 star events and 3 star events during the past 24 months are not permitted.

In the Dressage Test, each athlete's good marks awarded by the Ground Jury are converted into penalty points. In the Cross-

Country Test, each athlete's penalties are the total faults incurred at obstacles and time penalties for exceeding time allowed. In the Jumping Test, each athlete's penalties are the total faults incurred at obstacles as well as time penalties for exceeding time allowed.

Eventing Team

In the Eventing Team competition, the classification will be decided by adding together the penalties of the three best placed riders of each team. The team with the lowest total penalties will be declared the winner. The team with the second lowest total penalties will be awarded second place, and so on. In the event of equality for the top three placing, the classification will be decided by the best combined highest three placing.

Eventing Individual

The Individual Final Jumping Test will take place after the Team Jumping as the second round of Jumping Test. The 20 best placed riders, including those tied for the 20th place, classified in the Eventing Team Competition (maximum 2 riders per nation) will qualify to participate.

The final classification for Eventing Individual competition is the rider with the lowest total penalties incurred in all three tests. The rider with the second lowest total penalties will be awarded second place and so on. In the event of equality between two or more competitors, the rider with the best overall Cross-Country Test score is better placed. A competitor who is eliminated in any tests of Dressage, Cross-Country and Jumping is eliminated to participate in the following Eventing Tests. Rider, who for any



reason failed to complete the entire competition, will be awarded 1000-penalty points.

Jumping

Each participating NOC can enter a maximum of four rider/five horse combinations with one reserved horse for substitution. For Jumping Team event, an NOC can enter a maximum of four riders/horses combinations, and a minimum of three riders/horses combinations. Substitution of horse and withdrawal of rider must be made by 18:00 the day before the Team Competition, with letter from the Vet. Delegate or Medical Doctor.

In the Jumping Competitions, there are two rounds in the Jumping Team, and two rounds in the Jumping Individual Competition. Team Competition Round 1 and Round 2 are also qualifiers for the Jumping Individual. Jumping Individual will consist of two rounds, Round 1 and Round 2.

Jumping Team (140cm)

In the Jumping Team, the classification will be decided by adding the total penalties of the three best placed riders of each team in the Team Round 1 and Round 2. The team with the lowest combined penalties will be declared the winner. The team with the second highest total penalties scores will be awarded second place, and so on. In case of equality of penalties for the top three placing, there will be a Jump-off against the clock, in which all team competitors must take part. The total penalties and time of the three best placed riders will decide the winner.

Jumping Individual (150cm)

Individual Final is limited to the 40 best placed riders, including those tied for 40th place, after adding the penalties incurred in the qualifiers Team Competition Round 1 and Round 2. A maximum of 3 riders per NOC are allowed to start in the Individual Round 1.

Individual Final Competition Round 2 is limited to the twenty-five (25) best placed riders, including those tied for 25th place, according to results of Individual Round 1. A maximum of two (2) riders per NOC are allowed to enter in the Individual Round 2.

The final classification for Jumping Individual will be decided by adding together penalties incurred in the Individual Round 1 and Round 2. The rider with the lowest penalties will be declared the winner, and so on. In case of equality of penalties for the top three placing, there will be a Jump-off against the clock.

International Technical Officials, i. e. Technical Delegates, International Judges, Stewards, Veterinary Surgeons and Course Designers are nominated and appointed by Asian Equestrian Federation from relevant FEI lists. National Technical Officials are

nominated by Chinese Equestrian Association and appointed by Guangzhou Asian Games Organizing Committee (GAGOC).

Members of Appeal Committee are nominated by AEF and appointed by GAGOC.

Protests and Appeals

Protests and Appeals lodged against decisions made by Ground Jury shall be submitted to Appeal Committee and go through the standard procedures in line with FEI rules.

Saddlery

Horses and competitors shall be equipped with proper saddlery in line with relevant FEI rules and regulations and Stewards are responsible for the Enforcement of the rules and regulations.

Medical Control Program

Medical Control Program is conducted in line with the regulations made by OCA Medical Committee for the operations of the 16th Asian Games and the standard procedures made by World Anti-Doping Agency. Horse MCP samples are analyzed by Hong Kong Jockey Club laboratory in line with relevant FEI procedures.

Doping control for human athletes will be conducted in accordance to OCA Anti-Doping Rules applicable to the Games and follow the standards under World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) and the FEI Anti-Doping Rules for Human Athletes (ADRHA).



Victory Ceremony

The best three competitors of each event are awarded with gold medal, silver medal and bronze medal.

The horses and competitors are ushered in by relevant competition staff and get to the waiting area properly 15 minutes before the Victory Ceremony, and afterwards present a lap of honor to the audience. Dress and saddlery of the placed horses and competitors have to be the same as in the competition.

All Sport-specific information for Equestrian will be available at the sport information desks. They are located at the competition venue and at the Sport Information Center (SIC) in the Athletes' Village.
